## Real deal: Mundine claims IBO belt in split decision



AFTER last night winning a brutal brawl with IBO middleweight champion Daniel Geale to claim his third world title, a jubilant Anthony Mundine predicted he would not have as much trouble overcoming the likes of Kelly Pavlik and Felix Sturm when he seeks to unify the belt.

Mundine won one of the best fights ever staged between two-home grown boxers by the narrowest of margins in a split points decision.

After slugging it out for 12 rounds, both fighters claimed victory and the judges could not agree on a The Main Event commentary team also awarded the fight to Mundine, who suggested he might fight Pavlik, the WBC and WBO champion, before the end of the year. He is also the No.1 contender to Germany's WBA champion Felix Sturm, who is meant to have a mandatory title defence against Mundine by November 1.

But after his war with Geale, Mundine declared that they would not be as tough an opponent as the 2002 Commonwealth Games gold medallist. Geale showed his intentions from the outset and immediately tried to get on the front foot but he could not match Mundine's glove speed and evasive skills.

A second-round knock-down proved decisive in the end, and after felling Geale with the

A second-round knock-down proved decisive in the end, and after felling Geale with the combination of a left jab and right hook, Mundine readied himself for an early kill but he found in Geale arguably the toughest opponent he had faced since Kessler beat him in Sydney four years ago. The win gives Mundine the rare distinction of being a world titleholder in dual weight divisions, making the former NSW Origin star one of Australia's greatest boxers and sportsmen of all time. It has also all but put paid to any chance of a rematch with Danny Green and he also ruled out another fight with Geale, saying he had greater aspirations.

## AUSTRALIAN BOXER DANNY GREEN EYES BOUT WITH LEGENDARY ROY JONES JR

Danny Green's dream bout against legendary boxer Roy Jones Jr is a step closer to becoming reality following Wednesday's announcement that the two men will fight on the same card. The Green Machine will take on Argentine cruiserweight Julio Cesar Dominguez on the undercard to Jones's bout against Jeff Lacy in New Orleans on August 15.

If Green beats the dangerous Dominguez and Jones can provide the magic against Lacy, the pair could fight each other in Australia later this year.

"Roy Jones Jr is a bloke who I, and millions of other people, have idolised," Green said. "He's a legend of the sport. But if this fight takes place I certainly won't be overawed. For me, the motivation will be to take down a legend." Jones has not fought overseas as a professional, as he has been notoriously travel-shy since his controversial loss in a 1988 Olympic final in Seoul. Speaking on a video conference call from the US, Jones said he was prepared to Australia to fight because he believed he would get a fair shake. Green, 36, (26-3, 23KOs), won the World Boxing Council interim super-middleweight title and the World Boxing Association light-heavyweight title before retiring briefly from the sport. The Sydney-based West Australian said a fight with Jones, who has won world titles as a middleweight, super-middleweight, light-heavyweight and heavyweight, would probably be the biggest in Australian boxing history. Asked about a rematch with arch-rival Anthony Mundine, Green said that wasn't part of his mindset and that Mundine paled to insignificance at world level, compared with Jones. Jones (53-5, 39 KOs), meanwhile, said that he could train with the Mundine camp in Australia. He has an association with Mundine, as his father has worked with the Australian fighter.
